

## Honey Products October 17

This past June, Jordan Marcelain gave a presentation on honey bees. He volunteered to do another presentation October 17 showing us on different products made from honey.



Honey is an excellent ingredient for skincare and cosmetic products because it doesn't come off or grow mold. It serves as a moisturizing, clarifying, antibacterial, and/or flavoring agent. Lip balm, face masks, and hair conditioner are just a few examples. Honey lends a sweet, distinct but not overwhelming scent to candles, where it can be used as a main or additional scent. Honeycomb beeswax candles are one example where the trace of honey is the star of the show. Another example is soy

candles with honey and other ingredients such as vanilla.



Propolis is made when honeybees chew the buds of trees and conifers and mix them with their saliva. It has antibacterial, antiviral, anti-inflammatory, antioxidant, and antifungal properties that make it popular as a health supplement but can also be used as an ointment for wound and cut healing.
